

Jacksonville Symphony Civic Orchestra Plans For Second Year Performance

Jacksonville, FL (October 20, 2016) --- The inaugural year of the Jacksonville Symphony Civic Orchestra was so well-received that plans have been initiated for year two. The second Civic Orchestra performance under the baton of conductor Nathan Aspinall is slated for Friday, January 27, 2017 at 8pm in Robert E. Jacoby Symphony Hall in the Times-Union Center for the Performing Arts. Rehearsals will be the week of January 24th, 25th and 26th from 7 to 9:30pm. There will be a party following the January 27th performance for all participants.

Registration is \$50 and registration information is available at www.jaxsymphony.org/civic-orchestra/. Participants must be 22 years of age or older, be able to read music and play a standard orchestra instrument. The deadline for registration is Saturday, December 10. There are no auditions and notice of acceptance will be made on or after December 20th.
