

## Symphonic Night at the Movies Presents Warner Bros. Studio Bugs Bunny at the Symphony II on April 1 and 2

Jacksonville, FL (March 20, 2017) --- The Jacksonville Symphony's Symphonic Night at the Movies on April 1 and 2 will combine the joy of cartoons with classical music. Warner Bros. Studio Presents Bugs Bunny at the Symphony II, accompanied by the Jacksonville Symphony and conducted by Emmy Award winning George Daugherty will highlight beloved characters such as Bugs Bunny, Tom and Jerry, Pepe Le Pew, Elmer Fudd, and Daffy Duck. Fan favorites such as "What's Opera Doc?", "Show Biz Bugs" and "Rabbit of Seville" include music from Wagner's "Die Walküre," "The Barber of Seville," and Liszt's "Hungarian Rhapsody No. 2."

Bugs Bunny at the Symphony II is the second sequel to the critically acclaimed Bugs Bunny on Broadway, which originally debuted in 1990. The film with orchestra concert was created and produced by George Daugherty and David Ka Lik Wong.

Conductor George Daugherty is one of the classical music world's most diverse artists. In addition to his 25-year conducting career which has included appearances with the world's leading orchestras, ballet companies, opera houses and concert artists, Daugherty is also an Emmy Award-winning and five-time Emmy-nominated creator whose professional profile includes major credits as a director, writer and producer for television, film, innovative and unique concerts, and the live theater.

Bugs Bunny at the Symphony II is part of the Fidelity National Financial Pops Series and will be presented on Saturday April 1 @ 7 PM and Sunday April 2 @ 3 PM at Robert E. Jacoby Hall in the Times Union Center for Performing Arts.
